MEMORANDUM FOR SUPPLY PROCESS REVIEW COMMITTEE (PRC) MEMBERS

SUBJECT: Withdrawal of Approved DLMS Change (ADC) 39, Special Program Requirements (SPR)
Process Use of Reject Status Codes (Supply/MILSTRAP)

This memorandum withdraws ADC 39, and the associated request, for implementation date memorandums in their entirety. The ADC 39 requirement was intended to allow DOD 4000.25-2-M, MILSTRAP, reject transaction codes to be used with SPR Status transactions, to facilitate SPR rejection for Service legacy systems, that had not fully implemented the MILSTRAP Document Identifier Code DZG Reject transactions with the SPR process. However, no Service reported being able to implement this change in legacy systems, as resources were focused on their system modernization initiatives.

In August 2000, DLMSO released a Request for Implementation Date memorandum for ADC 39, SPR Process Use of Reject Status Codes. The only response received at that time was a Navy response, indicating that implementation was held in abeyance until their ERP replaced their legacy systems. On May 25, 2006, DLMSO reissued the request for implementation date memorandum, and noted that if this change was not being implemented in Service legacy systems, the requirement should be reevaluated in that light, and possibly withdrawn. Under modernized systems implementing DLMS, transaction rejects formerly accomplished by MILSTRAP Document Identifier Code DZG reject, will be accomplished using DLMS 824R Reject transactions. As DLMS is implemented, the DLMS 824R reject capability should be an integral part of that effort, and having a different transaction, providing the SPR rejects under DLMS is neither desired nor intended. Accordingly, in light of the absence of implementation in Service legacy systems, this ADC 39 requirement is being withdrawn, and should not be considered for current or future systems.

Withdrawal of ADC 39 was discussed at Supply PRC meeting 07-02 in October 2007, and the Defense Logistics Agency, which originated this change, subsequently confirmed that the requirement could be withdrawn.
