
MEMORANDUM FOR SUPPLY PROCESS REVIEW COMMITTEE MEMBERS

SUBJECT: Approved Defense Logistics Management System (DLMS) Change (ADC) 146,
Revision to DLMS Supplement (DS) 888A, Small Arms Data Change (Supply)
(Staffed by PDC 151)

The attached change to DOD 4000.25-M, DLMS, is approved for immediate implementation. The updated DLMS Supplement will be posted to the Defense Logistics Management Standards Office (DLMSO) Web site (<http://www.dla.mil/j-6/dlms/ICs/Default.htm>) within 30 days from the above date for implementation planning. DLMSO will submit this transaction concurrently to the governing Federal Implementation Convention to the DOD Electronic Data Interchange Standards Management Committee, and the Federal Electronic Data Interchange Standards Management Coordinating Committee, and applicable working groups.

A follow-on ADC will be released to incorporate the DOD Unique Identification (UID) concept of unique item identifier (UII), in addition to the serial number, to DS 888A. The DOD Small Arms Serialization Program (DODSASP) is not exempt from UID policy, hence DS 888A will be updated in the subsequent ADC to allow for small arms tracking by UII or serial number, until such time as the DOD Components fully implement the OSD UID policy. Revise Small Arms Data Change, DLMS Supplement (DS) 888A (Supply)

1. ORIGINATOR:

a. Service/Agency: Defense Logistics Agency (DLA)

b. Originator: HQ DLA, Distribution and Reutilization Policy, Distribution Management Division, Materiel Accountability and Distribution Policy Branch (J-3731).

2. FUNCTIONAL AREA: Supply/DOD Small Arms Serialization Program.

3. REQUESTED CHANGE:

a. Title: Revise Small Arms Data Change, DLMS Supplement (DS) 888A.

b. Description of Change: This change modifies one segment of the DS 888A, Small Arms Data Change and the commensurate DAAS map to reflect additional conditions required by the Small Arms Multi-Field Corrections, MILSTRAP DI Code DSA. Since the existing DAAS map for the 888A hasn't been used yet, DLA Distribution Standard System (DSS) will be the first user. The change also documents a Change in terminology from unique item identifier (UII) to serial number necessary to clarify that small arms serial numbers are not UIIs under conditions imposed by the DOD Unique Identification (UID) initiative.

c. Procedures: Change DLMS Supplement (DS) 888A to Federal Implementation Convention 888A in accordance with (IAW) the following. Additional administrative changes not identified in PDC 151 are identified by **highlighted text**:

d. Alternatives: None.

4. REASON FOR CHANGE:

a. These changes are required to ensure DLA Distribution Standard System (DSS) interface with DOD Small Arms Serialization Program (DODSASP) trading partners (i.e., DOD Central/Army Component Registry, Air Force Component Registry and DLA Component Registry) is uninterrupted as DSS migrates to the Defense Logistics Management System (DLMS). Please note -- since DLA doesn't routinely store weapons owned by the Navy, Marines or Coast Guard – DSS has no automated interface with the Navy Component registry. To ensure that the DOD Central Registry audit trail, DSS reports small arms owned by Navy, Marine Corps, and Coast Guard directly to the DOD Central Registry.

b. Change in terminology from unique item identifier (UII) to serial number is necessary to clarify that small arms serial numbers are not UIIs. Serial numbers presently used for tracking in the DOD Small Arms Serialization Program (DODSASP) do not comprise a UII under conditions imposed by the DoD Unique Identification (UID) initiative. NOTE: A follow-on ADC will be released to incorporate the UID concept of UII in addition to the serial number.

c. This change complements ADC 147, Revise DS 140A, Small Arms Reporting to Reflect Serial Number and Other Administrative Changes. ADC 147 revises DS 140A to clarify that serial numbers as used in DS 140A are not equivalent to UID UIIs. ADC 147 is available at: <http://www.dla.mil/j-6/dlms/eLibrary/Changes/approved.asp>.

5. ADVANTAGES and DISADVANTAGES:

a. Advantages:

- Supports DLMS implementation.
- Preserves current interfaces with DODSASP legacy systems.
- Corrects DS 888A to reflect “SN-Serial Number”, rather than identify a serial number as a unique item identifier (UII). The UII terminology that had been carried in DS 888A prior to this change was comparable to the serial number, and did not equate to a UII under the new DOD UID definition since a serial number lacks “uniqueness” when used alone. Supports DODSASP legacy systems use of serial numbers.

b. Disadvantages: None.
