4. REQUESTED CHANGE(S):

a. **Brief Overview of Change:** This change realigns the United States Coast Guard (USCG) from Department of Defense to the Federal Government for purposes of identification in the DoDAAD. The USCG is an agency of the Department of Homeland Security, as such, it is necessary to properly record its Organization Type Code as being F for Federal Agency, vice D for DoD.

b. **Background:**

(1) Coast Guard organization and operation is as set forth in Title 33 of the Code of Federal Regulations.

(2) On November 25, 2002, U.S. President George W. Bush signed into law the Homeland Security Act and designated the Coast Guard to be placed under the U.S. Department of Homeland Security. Completion of the transfer of administrative control from the U.S. Department of Transportation to the U.S. Department of Homeland Security occurred the following year, on March 1, 2003.

(3) The U.S. Coast Guard reports directly to the Secretary of Homeland Security. However, under Title 14 U.S.C. as amended by section 211 of the Coast Guard and Maritime Transportation Act of 2006, upon the declaration of war and when Congress so directs in the declaration, or when the President directs, the Coast Guard operates under the Department of Defense as a Service in the Department of the Navy.

c. Requested Change in Detail:

(1) There should be a trigger to set the default values in the ORG_TYPE_CD field when new records are created and to establish the baseline for the field. All criteria specified in ADC 1190 (DoDAAD Org Type Code) remain unchanged, except for the following:

- Set ORG_TYPE_CD to F if the first character of the DoDAAC is: Z

(2) To correct existing DoDAAC records, Transaction Services will run a SQL update on the DoDAAD database to change the ORG_TYPE_CD field from D to F where the first character of the DoDAAC is Z for USCG.

(3) Change the title in the ORG_TYPE_CD table to read F = Federal Agencies. Below is the complete table:

- D = DoD
- F = Federal Agencies
- S = State/Local
- N = NGO
- X = Foreign

d. Revisions to DLM 4000.25 Manuals: N/A

e. Alternatives: None

5. REASON FOR CHANGE: USCG is part of the Department of Homeland Security and as such, the organization type code should be F to indicate Federal Agency.

6. ADVANTAGES AND DISADVANTAGES:

a. Advantages: Additional tool for auditability and quality control.

b. Disadvantages: None noted.

7. ADDITIONAL FUNCTIONAL REQUIREMENTS: None noted.

8. ESTIMATED TIME LINE/IMPLEMENTATION TARGET: Authorized for immediate implementation when this DLMS change is released as an ADC. Target timeline for Transaction Services updates to the DoDAAD is 60 days from the publication of the ADC.

9. ESTIMATED SAVINGS/COST AVOIDANCE ASSOCIATED WITH IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS CHANGE: The dollar savings amount is unknown. The point of this change is to improve the quality of the DoDAAD data.

c. **Automated Information Systems (AIS)**: Army and Air Force must make the necessary changes to their respective DoDAAC applications to mirror these changes to the DoDAAD.
